Interesting facts

- All sawfish have cartilage skeleton, not bone.
- They can grow up to 14—18 feet long.
- Sawfish are also known as the Carpenter Shark
- They can have 15 to 20 babies in a litter
- Small tooth sawfish are critically endangered


